SUPERVISION RECEIVED

Direction is received from the Director of the Nursing Education Programs.

SUPERVISION EXERCISED

Indirect administrative supervision for Instructors and functional supervision of staff members.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Masters degree with a major in Nursing, plus five to seven years relevant nursing and teaching experience or a combination of education and experience from which comparable knowledge and skills are acquired.

- Broad-based knowledge and skills related to nursing education and clinical nursing practices.
- Experience teaching practical nursing skills and theory.
- RN. License required.
- Strong organizational, administrative and budget management skills.
- Ability to communicate and deal effectively with and represent the program to the college, nursing and health care, and student communities, and a wide range of individuals throughout the State.
